The Pub Design and Conservation Award scheme was founded to encourage high standards of architectural design in the refurbishment and conservation of existing public houses and in the construction of new. It aims to stimulate interest and awareness in the many diverse factors that contribute to the unique character of the British pub as an institution. Since its inception in 1982, the Pub Design Award has become an accolade sought after by breweries, publicans and designers.

Once again this year's awards are run in association with English Heritage and the Victorian Society.

## AWARD CATEGORIES

The awards are made annually for real ale public houses completed and opened or reopened for trade in the year preceding that of the award. There are four categories:

- 1 New Build
- 2 Conversion of existing buildings to pub use
- 3 Refurbishment and conservation of existing public houses
- 4 The English Heritage Award for conservation

Judges will assign entries between categories where necessary.

Entries are welcome from anywhere in the British Isles.

## THE AWARDS

The awards in each category will take the form of a specially designed plaque which may be fixed permanently to the winning pub. In addition certificates will be presented to the brewery or owners and to those concerned with the design and execution.

## ENTRIES

Entries may be made by any party.

*The work must have been completed and the public house opened or re-opened for trade between 1st January 2008 to 31st December 2008.*

Each entry must be on a separate form or on a photocopy thereof.

## SUBMISSION OF MATERIAL

Entries shall consist of the following material:

- Completed entry form
- Up to two typed A4 sheets describing fully the project and its design. This summary is taken by judges on surveying trips and should be self-explanatory without plans or photographs.
- Two sets of 10 x 8 inch colour photographs (not transparencies) showing all aspects of the building interior and exterior. A maximum of six prints can alternatively be emailed to [jon.howard@camra.org.uk](mailto:jon.howard@camra.org.uk).
- Drawings or prints showing the planning and design details and including a location plan.
- A map of the location of the entry is necessary to allow the assessors to find the pub.

Each item of material submitted must clearly bear the name and address of the public house concerned. Entries must not be submitted in fixed binding as the material will be required for display. Entries need not be mounted, and should not be mounted on board of more than A3 size.

Winning entries will be asked to supply additional photographs for press and promotional purposes.

*All entries will be acknowledged.*

## JUDGING

The Awards will be judged by CAMRA's Pubs Group which, since its formation in 1979, has developed an unequalled reputation in the fields of pub preservation and architecture, and has among its own ranks a number of architects, planners, designers and sociologists.

The panel of judges for the 2009 awards will be drawn from among their number plus designers and conservation experts from outside CAMRA.

Preliminary selections may be made from the submitted material. The judges will visit as many entries as they deem necessary.

The judges' decision shall be final and their discretion to make or withhold an award is absolute. Neither they nor CAMRA Ltd will enter into any discussion or correspondence regarding them.

## PRESENTATION OF THE AWARD

Presentation ceremonies will be arranged for all award winning entries.

## PUBLICATION OF ENTRIES

All material submitted in connection with entries must be free from copyright or other restrictions in connection with reproduction in the national, local and technical press and on television and radio, and CAMRA Ltd reserves the right, without payment of fees or royalties, to use for publicity purposes in connection with the awards all materials submitted and suitably acknowledged.

Entries will not be returned and material will become the property of CAMRA Ltd.
